

Promoting Positive Adult-Child Interaction

- Engage in one-to-one interactions with children
- Get at the child's level for face-to-face interactions
- Use a pleasant, calm voice and simple language
 - Provide warm, responsive physical contact
- Follow the child's lead and interest during play
- Help children understand classroom expectations
- Redirect children when they engage in challenging behavior
 - Listen to children and encourage them to listen to others
- Acknowledge children for their accomplishments and effort
- Provide learning environments that are positive, sensitive, responsive and include frequent individualized interactions
- Structure the physical environment, equipment and materials in ways that promote quality social interactions among children, parents and teachers
 - Implement an engaging curriculum that includes opportunities for each child to participate
 - Respect and validate children's cultural and language backgrounds
- Plan and implement experiences that are of interest to children and include content that promotes and sustains
 - the development of positive child-child and adult-child relationships
 - Provide classroom routines that are consistent and predictable
 - Use effective well-timed transitions that include warnings about transitions that preview what is going to
 - happen next, and communicate clearly what is expected of children
 - Provide positive attention that encourages each child
 - Find ways to validate how children are feeling and what they are experiencing
 - Be actively engaged in learning new things with children
 - Identify ways to reinforce children's positive behaviors and learning
 - Maintain high expectations related to children's behavior and learning across all developmental domains

Great expectations

What do you expect your children to be able to do? Having appropriate expectations, and letting your child know what they are, will help them reach their potential. These tips can help.

Be realistic. Set expectations that your Child is capable of meeting. For example, it's reasonable to expect a preschooler or kindergartner to use an "inside" voice in the classroom and to carry his backpack. But he might forget sometimes and need to be reminded.


Be clear. Let your child hear you talk about your expectations. You could say, "Everyone in our classroom helps out." Or let him overhear an expectation stated as a compliment: "Jesse always listens to my instructions."

Be flexible. Your expectations should grow as your children grow. This year, you might expect him to go to school every day, and next year, perhaps you'll expect him to complete homework each evening.

Tip: As he gets older, you can say things like "When you graduate from high school..." or "When you're in college..."

T.E.A.C.H. Early Childhood has emerged as an effective nati onal strategy to help address the need for a wellqualified, fairly compensated and stable workforce. The **T.E.A.C.H. (Teacher Education and Compensation Helps) Early Childhood** Project (T.E.A.C.H.) was created by Child Care Services Association in 1990 in North Carolina. It now is operating in 23 states and the District of Columbia. T.E.A.C.H. provides comprehensive scholarships to enable early childhood teachers to take coursework leading to credentials and degrees at local community colleges and universities within each state. The model requires that early childhood teachers commit to staying in their child care program or the field for six months to a year, depending on the scholarship model.

- T.E.A.C.H. increases child care quality without More regulation or increases in parent fees.
- T.E.A.C.H. supports job growth by reducing costs to small businesses nationwide.
- T.E.A.C.H. is a shared cost model not an entitlement program.
- T.E.A.C.H. purchases local college classes and materials.
- T.E.A.C.H. is about helping teachers and family child care providers help themselves.
- > **T.E.A.C.H.** supports working adults.
- T.E.A.C.H. supports the steady rise in education levels for the employed.
- T.E.A.C.H. addresses parent beliefs that early childhood must have formal education to work with their child.
- T.E.A.C.H. helps teachers continue to work in the field and in their classroom and provides stable settings for young children in care in unstable economic times.
- T.E.A.C.H. has been supported in a bi-partisan way across the country for over 20 years.
- T.E.A.C.H. is completely accountable both internally and externally.

T.E.A.C.H. Scholarship Application Requirements

- Must work in a licensed child care center or licensed/registered family home.
- Work in the classroom a minimum of 30 hours per week.
- Make less than \$15.00 per hour.

Compensation and Benefits

- ➢ \$75 Travel Stipend per semester
- ▶ \$300 completion bonus at end of contract year.
- Sponsoring center offers 2% raise or \$300 bonus at completion of contract year for Associate Scholarship
- \$150 bonus for completion of CDA Credential 80
 % of tuition and books
- Center compensation for release time.
- 85% of the CDA Assessment Fee Supports recipient through administrative and counseling support.
